

Conference venue

The Faculty of Sport of the University of Porto displays modern and very well equipped facilities for sports and academic activities.

It is located at the "Asprela pole" of the University and is sorrounded by the Faculty of Engineering, the Institute of Pathology and Immunology of the University of Porto (devoted to cancer research) and the Biotechnology Department of the Portuguese Catholic University. Since the University of Porto is an open institution, participants in the ISBS2011 will be very welcome in any one of these locations.

The "Asprela pole" of the University is well served of connections (metro, buses and taxis) to the city centre, the city historical and riverside centres, and the new social and business centre: Boavista.

During summer, the weather in Porto is quite attractive. It's warm (between 20 to 30° C), inviting for outdoor living, active leisure and friendship, and we have day light from 06.00 a.m. to 22.00 p.m.. Light clothes are recommended. A pull-over or a sweater may be useful at night. Sporting clothes are needed for the animated sports activities organised during the congress or for those delegates that want to perform by their own at the sport facilities available at the congress venue (exercise room, tennis, squash, swimming pool, running circuit, or sauna). Portuguese people are warm and friendly, very solicit, cooperative and peaceful. It's a safe country with low criminality, compared with most of the other European countries. Porto is, indeed, a safe city.



The Proceedings Book and the Abstracts Book will be published prior to the conference in two Supplement issues of the *Portuguese Journal of Sport Sciences* (indexed in Scielo, Latindex, and Sportdiscus).

Scientific Committee and refereeing

The peer-reviewing process of the abstracts and the paper submitted to Book of Abstracts and the Proceedings Book will be guaranteed by the Scientific Committee of the conference that will be selected from the Sports Biomechanicists community in accordance with the ISBS board, and then invited.

Travel and transportation

Travelling to Porto is easy. The city is well served with an International Airport (Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport), recently classified as one of the best in Europe. There are a number of international direct flights to Porto (Oporto). An alternative is to fly to Lisbon, and then to Porto. The Airport is located at 20km from the city centre. The airport is directly connected to the city by surface metro (estimated €2,50). Taxis are also available (estimated €15 to €25, depending on the hour of the day).

Major features

In 2011, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of Porto University and its increasing growing process among the European universities. The creation of the Biomechanics Laboratory of the Porto University (LABIOMEP), a joint venture of Sports, Medicine, Dentistry, and Engineering faculties, is also to be celebrated.

To further increase this celebration ambiance, we are also about to accomplish the first shared organization of a sport sciences international event between the two largest sport science faculties of the country.

In synthesis, we are intending to organize a "celebration conference", also to celebrate biomechanics, sport biomechanics, and ISBS!
